



## COVID-19 TRAVEL TIPS

In the “good old days” you just needed a passport and you were good to go on your holiday... now the most important travel document around is a Negative-PCR test! Please get familiar with the entry requirements of your destination and keep checking and re-checking on the requirements as things can change pretty regularly.

### GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

TravelDoc is a free site that quickly and efficiently verifies passengers' international travel documentation and health requirements, including those related to Covid-19, based on the travellers' routing and destination [www.traveldoc.aero](http://www.traveldoc.aero). ### PRE-DEPARTURE PCR TESTS

In many cases you will require a negative PCR test ahead of your trip. Please check this link for information: [www.ampath.co.za/travellers-resources](http://www.ampath.co.za/travellers-resources). A test certificate should contain the name of the passenger (as per passport), name and address of the testing laboratory, type of test stated as PCR test, date of sampling and the result of the test. SMS and electronic test notifications are not accepted.

### SEYCHELLES

Visit [advisory.seychelles.travel](http://advisory.seychelles.travel) for the most up to date information. Visitors must submit their negative PCR test results, flight and accommodation details before departure. Health travel authorisation is required. Visitors must submit their application for approval through the designated platform at this link: [seychelles.govtas.com](http://seychelles.govtas.com). This can only be done after travellers have received their PCR test results.

PCR testing for return to South Africa is available on Mahe, Praslin, La Digue, and on the private islands. The current cost of a PCR test is SCR2 500 per person\*\*. This excludes transport to and from the clinic. Our ground handlers will be glad to assist with these arrangements which can be booked and paid on arrival.

### MALDIVES

All guests travelling to and from Maldives are required to submit a self-health declaration within 24 hours prior to their departure to and again from Maldives. PCR tests for return to South Africa are available on each island resort and start from \$150 per person\*\*

## ZANZIBAR

All passengers will be required to complete Zanzibar's Traveller Surveillance Form on the flight to Zanzibar, for hand-in to Zanzibar Airport Authorities, and will be subject to temperature and advanced screening on arrival. Please note that there is NO PCR Test requirement for entry into Zanzibar, however there may be a requirement by the airline. Kenya Airways does require a negative PCR test.

PCR tests are available at 3 clinics in Zanzibar and some resorts offer a mobile testing option. Costs start from \$80 per person excluding transport.\*\* Our ground handlers will be glad to assist with these arrangements which can be booked and paid on arrival.

## MAURITIUS

Mauritius is currently closed for short-stay visits and has a 14 day mandated quarantine in place. Visit [www.mymauritius.travel](http://www.mymauritius.travel) for up-to-date information

## THAILAND

## RETURNING HOME

Passengers travelling to South Africa are strongly advised to hold a printed medical certificate of a negative Covid-19 PCR test result obtained within 72 hours prior to departure, from the date of examination.
